A Resolution of the Commissioners' Court of Medina County, Texas April 2007

Whereas: Medina County contains neighborhoods, natural features, geographic areas and roadways that have great historic cultural, scenic or natural resource value to the entire State of Texas, and

Whereas: the scenic, historical, cultural and natural resources of Medina County need protection, and

Whereas: the Great Springs of Texas and the Northern and Southern Edwards Aquifer are irreplaceable natural features essential to the settlement of Texas and the waters of these aquifers and springs are essential to the natural resources of the State and the economic vitality of the State, and

Whereas: The orderly development of the area and our watersheds is of concern not only to Medina County, but to all counties that are within the Texas Hill Country, and

Whereas: Without adequate development regulations, these areas may be developed in ways that endanger public water supplies and interfere with the proper use of the area to the detriment of the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare, and

Whereas: Representative David McQuade Leibowitz of District 117 has introduced HB 3328, on behalf of all counties that lie within Hill Country/Edwards Aquifer region, that would empower those counties, including Medina County, to adequately plan and manage future growth within the boundaries so described in this act

Therefore: The Commissioners' Court of Medina County pray to the honorable members of the 80th Legislature of the Great Republic of Texas to use your powers, and influence to ensure that HB 3328 becomes the law of our great state.
