RESOLUTION REQUESTING PUBLIC MEETING AND CONTESTED CASE HEARING
CONCERNING THE APPLICATION OF VULCAN CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS, LLC FOR AN
AIR QUALITY PERMIT TO AUTHORIZE CONSTRUCTION OF A CONCRETE BATCH PLANT
ON STATE HIGHWAY 46 IN KENDALL COUNTY, TEXAS

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court has the authority and responsibility to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the County's residents; and

WHEREAS, VULCAN CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS, LLC has made application with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for an air quality permit, registration no. 1149060 (hereinafter the "application") which would authorize construction of a permanent concrete batch plant located on property adjacent to State Highway 46 near the intersection with Stone Wall Drive in Kendall County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court has a concern about the adverse impact the location of a concrete batch plant at the proposed location would have on the air quality, the environment and other factors affecting the health, safety, welfare and quality of life of the residents of Kendall County, particularly those residing within 440 yards of the proposed location for the plant; and

WHEREAS, the proposed location of the plant is near a school attended by students who participate in outdoor activities and whose health, safety, welfare, and quality of life would be adversely affected by the location of the plant at the proposed location;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commissioners Court of Kendall County, Texas requests that the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality conduct a public meeting concerning the application.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commissioners Court of Kendall County, Texas requests a contested case hearing concerning the application.
